Staatsgalerie Stuttgart

Internationally renowned collection in the spectacular post-modern Stirling Building

The Staatsgalerie is one of Germany's great art museums. The collection comprises painting, sculpture and graphic art from the Middle Ages to the present, including many masterpieces and an internationally outstanding collection of modern art. Special highlights are Oskar Schlemmer's »Figurinen zum Triadischen Ballett« from the early 1920s, the famous »Rückenakte« (1909–1930) by Henri Matisse, numerous works by Picasso, including the sculpture group »Die Badenden« (1956) and the Joseph Beuys Room, which was still personally furnished by the artist. The museum offers various changing exhibitions.

Kunstmuseum Stuttgart

is a contemporary and modern art museum. It contains one of the most important collections of the work of Otto Dix and also works from Willi Baumeister and Adolf Hölzel. The special exhibitions respond to current social developments and participate in public discourse.

The cubic museum building with 5000 m² of display space was designed by Berlin architects Hascher and Jehle. During the day it looks like a glass cube, and at nights the interior lighted limestone walls become visible.

The Kunstverein is conceived as a place for the open, and also controversial, investigation of the manifold methods and practices found in contemporary art, including wide-ranging sociopolitical fields of reference.

Galerie Stihl Waiblingen

The gallery focuses mainly on exhibitions of works on and from paper. Three temporary exhibitions per year present a varied spectrum ranging from classical drawings to design drawings, comics to strip cartoons, and sketches to digital drafts.

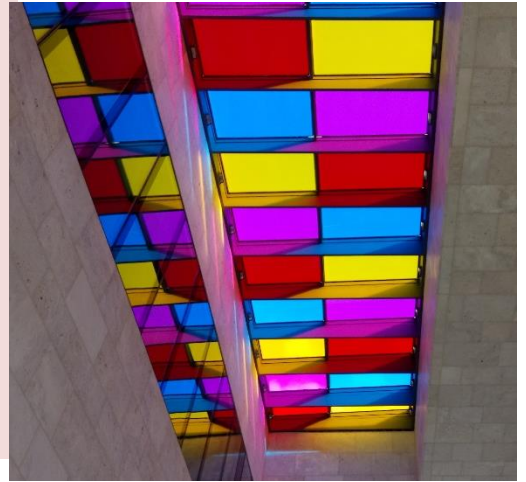
Museum Ritter

The theme of the collection is the square in recent and contemporary art, while the goal of the museum is to exhibit the collection and bring it to the public eye. In addition, three to four themed exhibitions are put on by this private institution each year.
